

I feel that I blossomed as Chemical Dependency Counselor this quarter. My internship at

Winter Quarter 2010 was at Pioneer Center North inpatient chemical dependency treatment in

Sedro-Woolley, WA. PCN serves individuals with multiple chemical dependency diagnosis who

have failed other treatment programs. The typical client is homeless, and entered treatment

involuntary from the court system. I wanted to learn the difference between inpatient and

outpatient treatment services. A large percent of the clients have a mental health diagnosis. I

wanted to gain skills within the multiple treatment issues community. I co-facilitate two

multiple treatment issues class. My second learning outcome was to learn how to co-facilitate

educational groups. I had the opportunity to play an active role in the addiction education class.

I feel like I accomplished my learning objectives this quarter. I assisted in the Relapse

Prevention, Addiction Education, Multiple Treatment Issues, and Core classes. I became

experienced with PCN curriculum. I read the Substance Abuse and Mental Illness Services

Administration guideline book on the dual diagnosis community. It was important for me to gain

experience with clients with Personality Disorders. I had several chances to practice redirection

within the MTI group. I had several opportunities to represent the clinical department during

team planning meetings. I also spent time job shadowing PCN case managers. I am now

familiar with many housing, and outpatient programs throughout Washington State. I understand

how government funding programs work. I felt well supported at PCN by staff members and the

clinical director.

I am glad that I challenged myself to select an internship site that I had reservations and fears about. I forced myself to talk to clients and staff members. The last nine months of internship has helped my professional self-esteem. I think the staff enjoyed my level of professionalism. My site supervisor remarked that I was more advanced than the other interns. I learn more about addiction and the system by spending time in the staff lunch room.
